 Races will be held over 200m from a standing start. Helms are expected to back (reverse) the boats up to the starting pontoons so that both hull tips are touching the pontoon.


 Teams of 8 paddlers and 1 helm.


 Helms can be of any age, but should be practised in helming a Bell Boat.

 Races will be timed. Winners of each heat will go through to the next round. The remainder will go through based on their elapsed time.

 For events of 6 entries and less, overall standings will be based on the results of 2 races, so that everyone is guaranteed a minimum of 2 races.

 In the event of a small number of entries in an event, we reserve the right to run 2 or more events at the same time, although the results will be considered separately for each event.

 The open mixed event must have a minimum of 4 female paddlers in the team. All other events (except open female, guide and brownies) can have any combination of genders. The open event can include females in it – there is no male-only event.

 Junior ages have been based on the system used in schools, based on age at the 1st September, to allow school year groups to paddle together.
